Unregistered vehicle permits

Revision 1 – 9th May 2007

Background

The previous Permit system provided owners of unregistered vehicles a means to obtain a permit to operate their vehicle for up to 7 days for about \$23. The permit enables unregistered vehicles to attend motor vehicle events and was ideal for owners of VVH vehicles that only wanted to attend one or two events per year. It was discontinued several years ago when the ACT Vehicle Registration scheme was amended to align with national motoring standards.

Following an approach by Council in late 2005, the Minister and Department of Urban Services staff acknowledged that UVPs can provide an avenue to foster our motoring heritage for vehicles that only come out of hiding a couple of times a year and have reinstated the Unregistered Vehicle Permit (UVP) for Veteran, Vintage and Historic (VVH) vehicles.

The new UVP system is an extension of the current UVP system that is available for non -VVH vehicles to move their vehicles for inspection and repairs only.

Current Situation (effective from March 2006)

The Department of Urban Services has agreed that Unregistered Vehicle Permits (UVPs) can now be issued to CRS eligible vehicles/motorcycles to attend Club events. This change to procedures follows the Council of ACT Motor Clubs negotiations with the Minister for Urban Services and Urban Services staff.

Members of Clubs affiliated with Council need to obtain the "Application for Unregistered Vehicle Permit to attend Club Event" signed and stamped by their Club Registrar (as they now do for their registration renewal) and take this to a Canberra Connect Shopfront together with proof of identity and the appropriate fee (\$18.30 for one permit or \$35.30 for two permits (i.e. for two 12 hour periods on a weekend)).

The permit issued will state that it is only valid between 7.00am to 7.00pm within the ACT and the words "to be used to attend a VVH rally only".

The Council of ACT Motor Clubs is hopeful that this new UVP system will bring some vehicles out of hiding and onto our roads for all to see and enjoy.
